Faculty Profile: Jeffrey P. Dambly

Jeff Dambly is an adjunct professor at the FSU College of Law, teaching Law Enforcement & Privacy this spring semester. Dambly serves as a senior attorney for the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, where he advises the Office of Statewide Intelligence and the Office of Statewide Investigative Services. In that role, he also serves as the privacy officer for the Florida Fusion Center, where he regularly provides training on privacy, civil rights and civil liberties to law enforcement agencies engaged in intelligence efforts across the state of Florida and the southeast region. He previously served as a criminal prosecutor in the Ninth Judicial Circuit of Florida. Dambly began teaching as an adjunct professor at FSU Law in 2014, and over the past several years has coached the Jessup International Law Moot Court team and has also taught Counterterrorism Law. Dambly previously taught International Law at the University of Central Florida. He holds a J.D. from the University of Florida, an LL.M. in national security and U.S. foreign relations law from the George Washington University, and is on track to earn a Master of Arts degree this fall in security studies from the Center for Homeland Defense and Security at the Naval Postgraduate School.

Simmons also clerks at Printy Law Firm, where he has drafted complaints for a variety of different types of suits, researched both state and federal law to support various types of legal documents, and assisted in the preparation of an appellate brief. 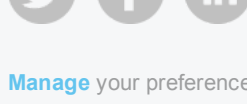
