#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

1. In order to qualify for the Certificate, *all* courses with the Certificate program that are offered for a grade must be taken for a grade.
2. Students must achieve an *average* of at least 74 in *all* graded Certificate classes taken to obtain the Certificate. The Certificate will be shown as “with honors” if the certificate course average is at least 86.
3. Students must complete the Upper Level Writing Requirement by completing a paper that is within the scope of the program, as approved by the Program Director.
4. The Certificate Seminar *does not* satisfy the Upper Level Writing Requirement. No credit hours associated with the Certificate Seminar are awarded unless both semesters of the seminar are completed. The three hours of the seminar are in addition to the minimum required for graduation with the J.D.
