Additional Information and Requirements:

1. In order to qualify for the certificate, ***all*** courses taken within the relevant certificate track(s) that are offered for a grade must be taken for a grade.
2. Students must achieve an average of at least 74 in ***all*** graded certificate classes taken to obtain the certificate. The certificate will be shown as “with honors” if the certificate course average is at least 84, “high honors” if the certificate course average is at least 89, and “high honors” if the certificate course average is at least 93.
3. Students must complete the Upper Level Writing Requirement by completing a paper that is within the scope of international or comparative law, as approved by the Program Director.
4. For F.S.U. students, 14 of the required 21 credits, including the 3 required courses, must be F.S.U. College of Law courses. All Oxford courses are F.S.U. College of Law courses. If a student transfers to F.S.U., 14 of the required 21 credits, including 2 of the 3 required courses, must be F.S.U. College of Law courses.
