Welcome to International Energy Law class!

Grading and Participation: You should come to class having read and thought about the material assigned for that class, and ready to participate in a discussion. I may increase or decrease your final grade by one step (e.g. B to B+ or B to B-) based on your participation in class. I may assign a number of ungraded exercises throughout the semester (which are not currently mentioned in the syllabus). I will not grade them; however, completing these assignments will help you in better understanding of the course material. Some of the assignments will include group work.

Depending on the final number of students enrolled for the course there will be one or two interactive sessions, which will count towards 40% (in case of two sessions 20%/20%) of the final grade. Participation in these sessions is compulsory, waiver can be granted on case by case basis (e.g. serious illness).

The final exam will be a written exam. Details about the form of this exam will be available after the Spring break.

Please note, audio/audiovisual recording of classes will be allowed only upon my consent and are subject to copyright.

Attendance: I will take attendance, and in accordance with the law School's accreditation requirements it is mandatory that you attend at least 80% of the scheduled classes. As such you will not receive credit if you miss more than five scheduled classes.
