The assignment for the first week's class in Twentieth Century American Legal History will be the following pages in Arnold Paul's Conservative Crisis and the Rule of Law: 1-5; 61-103; 131-84; 198-237. Because the book is out of print, copies must be checked out from the library (though of course you're welcome to obtain a copy of your own through online sources). You can pick up the book from Calvin Holloway, the Circulation Supervisor. He has copies in his office and needs to approve the extended checkout date (through the semester); the regular Circulation clerks can't check them out. Mr. Holloway is here during regular business hours and usually leaves at 4:30 p.m. If Mr. Holloway is not available, you can see if Research/IT Librarian Katie Miller is available to check out the book.

If you want to pick up your copy of Conservative Crisis and the Rule of Law prior to the semester's commencement, the library will check it out to you for the semester. If you drop the class, however, you must immediately bring the book back to the library for two reasons:
