WORKS IN PROGRESS

Group Consensus, Individual Consent explores principle 3.17 of the American Law Institute’s Principles of the Law of Aggregate Litigation and is part of George Washington University Law School’s upcoming symposium on the ALI project. The article raises thematic questions about the value of pluralism, group cohesion, governance, and legitimacy in nonclass aggregation. In so doing, it considers a fundamental concern in aggregate litigation about how we tolerate, encourage, or suppress pluralism within the coherent whole.

Litigating Together: Social, Moral, and Legal Obligations is the successor to *Litigating Groups*. This Article designs procedures for implementing the theoretical framework developed in *Litigating Groups*. It addresses the question of how we can employ social norms of promise-keeping, social agglomeration, compatibility, and the desire for means-end coherence to aid plaintiffs in achieving their ends, reaching consensus, mitigating client-client conflicts, and restoring the tether between large-scale litigants and their attorneys.
