ACCESS was established in 1976 and worked towards the cessation of all sports contact between the US and South Africa, so long as the South African government maintains its policy of apartheid. ACCESS participated in numerous campaigns against South Africa's participation in international sport competitions and worked to deny visas to South African athletes who wished to participate in sports events in the US.
