MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION AND SUPPORTING AUTHORITIES

The defendant Beatrice Foods Co. moves under 22 U.S.C. §2283 for a preliminary injunction against the plaintiffs and their attorneys enjoining the maintenance or institution of proceedings in the state court arising out of the matters litigated or resolved by the judgment of this Court and the affirmances by the Court of Appeals.

The injunction is necessary to protect or effectuate the judgment of this Court, to prevent re-litigation and re-argument of the same matters and issues decided by this Court and the Court of Appeals and to preclude circumvention of the judgment of this Court and the opinions and mandate of the Court of Appeals.

The foregoing case was fully tried and fully appealed being the subject of two appellate opinions, one affirming the 1986 verdict of the jury and another affirming the denial of plaintiffs' motion for new trial following lengthy and complex evidentiary hearings and arguments before this court.
