Its dual role is to settle in accordance with international law the legal disputes submitted to it by States, and to give advisory opinions on legal questions referred to it by duly authorized international organs and agencies.

2. United Nations Treaty-Monitoring Bodies <http://www.unhchr.ch/html/menu2/convmech.htm>

Some of the major international human rights treaties established committees of independent experts to monitor the implementation of the provisions contained in those treaties. To date, there are six treaty bodies. To obtain the full-text basic documents by and for the treaty bodies consult the *Treaty Bodies Database* (<http://www.unhchr.ch/tbs/doc.nsf>).

Four of these treaty bodies have established procedures under which individuals may submit complaints. Only complaints from persons within the jurisdiction of States that have formally accepted these procedures can be examined by the treaty bodies.

CAT determinations on admissibility and on the merits are considered jointly and published as *Views*. Determinations of inadmissibility are called *Decisions*. Both *Decisions* and *Views* are published as separate documents and together in the Committee's annual *Report of the Committee Against Torture*.

As the judicial organ of the European Common Market, the role of the Court is to ensure that the European Treaties are interpreted and applied in accordance with the law. The Court of Justice worked alone until September 1989 when the Council attached to it a **Court of First Instance (CFI)** which has jurisdiction to deal with all actions brought by individuals and companies against decisions of the Community institutions and agencies.

This Court is the judicial organ of the European Convention of Human Rights. Only states parties to the Convention and the European Commission on Human Rights may refer cases to the Court. Individual litigants may, however, submit complaints to the Commission that may eventually go to the Court.

INTER-AMERICAN SYSTEM

The American Convention on Human Rights establishes the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights and the Inter-American Court of Human Rights. The Commission has the jurisdiction to deal with individual petitions directed against a member state. Member states may file complaints against another only if both states have accepted jurisdiction to receive inter-state applications. The Court, having contentious and advisory jurisdiction, consists of the seven member states that are party to the Convention. Only the Commission and the states may bring cases to the Court.

On January 22, 2006, the first eleven Judges of the African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights were elected. When cases are decided, they will be available from the site listed above.

INTERNATIONAL LAW IN U.S. COURTS

Using traditional legal research techniques, searchers will be able to find U.S. cases related to international law in federal reporters using print digests or electronic databases such as Lexis and WestLaw. To locate cases in American courts that have construed international agreements, consult a West digest under the topic "Treaties" or "International law."

This volume contains the texts of major treaties as well as research references and case annotations.

This volume contains case notes and decisions involving Federal laws, multilateral and bilateral agreements, and proclamations which were not originally classified to the U.S. Code or were classified but were subsequently eliminated.

It is one of the most important sources for full-text judicial opinions in English.

International Law in Domestic Courts

This database contains English translations of case law from over 65 jurisdictions with scholarly commentary on important points of international law. Cases dating back to 2000 can be searched by country, keyword or full text search.
