III. ELECTIVE COURSES:

- A. To receive the Certificate, each student <u>must take at least nine</u> (9) credits of electives chosen from approved environmental, land use, natural resources, or energy courses; and possibly as many as twelve (12) elective credits if necessary to fulfill the 21-credit Certificate graduation requirement. Please see the Program web site for the list of approved elective courses.
- B. Students working on the *Journal of Land Use and Environmental Law* may use up to three (3) credits from the *Journal* to fulfill the elective course requirement.
- C. Up to six (6) credits of elective coursework may be taken through other departments on campus or other law school programs. A list of pre-approved courses for cross-registration is available on the Certificate web site. Students may also petition the Associate Dean for permission to receive Certificate credit for other programmatically relevant graduate school courses offered at FSU. Approval is not guaranteed, so please plan early and carefully if you wish to exercise this option.

To submit a petition, please e-mail the Associate Dean for Environmental Programs: (1) the name of the course; (2) the professor, department, and school offering the course; (3) the course description; and (4) a copy of the course syllabus (you will need to request this from the course instructor), and (5) a short statement of why this course advances Certificate program objectives that cannot be met through otherwise listed electives.

- D. All Program Courses for the Certificate must be taken for graded credit if so offered.
- E. The course/s that you use to satisfy the Certificate's Upper Level Writing/Seminar Requirement can also count toward the elective requirement.
- F. Students must have a final cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better for all Certificate Courses.

<u>NOTE</u>: For purposes of calculating Honors for the Certificate, the Associate Dean for Environmental Programs will use the courses in which the student received the BEST grades, if the student has taken more than the minimum number of elective courses necessary to meet both the Elective Course Requirement AND the overall 21-credit requirement.

V. EXPERIENTIAL/PRACTICAL SKILLS REQUIREMENT

This requirement is designed to expose students to practical aspects of environmental, land use, natural resources, and/or energy law before they graduate. As described below, students have four different options for fulfilling this requirement: (a) completing an externship or internship, (b) providing pro bono legal work, (c) participating in moot court, or (d) taking an approved practical skills course. A student must satisfy only one of the listed experiential/practical skills requirements listed below to qualify for the Certificate. Please note that you may NOT use paid employment experience to satisfy the Practical Skills requirement.

A. EXTERNSHIPS AND INTERNSHIPS: Externships and internships must be formalized through the law school and receive law school credit. To fulfill this requirement, the externship or internship must emphasize environmental, land use, natural resources, or energy law work but may do so in any capacity.

<u>NOTE</u>: Up to three (3) credits earned for an externship or internship may count toward the overall 21-credit requirement but NOT toward the minimum nine (9) credits of elective courses.

- B. PRO BONO WORK: To claim pro bono work to fulfill this requirement, you MUST: (1) complete <u>AT LEAST</u> 40 hours of pro bono work; and (2) document your employment and number of hours. To fulfill this requirement, the pro bono work must emphasize environmental, land use, natural resources, or energy law work but may do so in any capacity. Paid work experience is excluded.
- C. MOOT COURT: Participants in the Pace Law School Environmental Moot Court Competition or the Stetson University International Environmental Law Moot Court Competition automatically meet this requirement. Participants in other moot court competitions may petition the Associate Dean for Environmental Programs if that year's competition focuses on an environmental, land use, natural resource, or energy law issue.

NOTE: Up to three (3) credits earned for participating in moot court may count toward the overall 21-credit requirement but NOT toward the minimum nine (9) credits of elective courses.

D. SKILLS COURSES: Skills training courses used to fulfill this requirement must also fulfill the College of Law's Practical Skills requirement and must focus on environmental, land use, natural resources, or energy law. Approved courses are listed on the Certificate website.

<u>NOTE:</u> Up to three (3) credits earned for a skills training course may count toward the overall 21-credit requirement but NOT toward the minimum nine (9) credits of elective courses.
